Enclosed is the agency's appropriation year 2011 Monthly Financial Report as of January 31, 2011.

The following is a narrative summary of budget adjustments, projected budget variances, capital budget issues, and other key budget issues known at this time.

BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS

The budget adjustments listed below apply to the appropriation year 2011 report as of the end of January, 2011. Adjustments to Health and Human Service Commission's (HHSC) appropriation pattern as detailed in the Conference Committee version of S.B.1, Article II are described.

A1-A8	These adjustments include those pursuant to S.B. 1, Article XII to carry forward a portion of the general revenue reduction and American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds to appropriation year 2011 and allocate the general revenue reduction and enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) to the affected agencies for appropriation year 2011. Pursuant to the letter dated May 10, 2010, adjustments A3 through A5 reflect the additional HHSC ARRA Tier 2/3 federal increase and utilization of the freed up general revenue to mitigate Medicaid needs. Adjustments A6 through A8 are added this month pursuant to the letter dated November 3, 2010, and reflect the federal funds and freed up general revenue made available at HHSC from the six-month phased-down extension of the ARRA FMAP. Approval was also received for HHSC to
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utilize general revenue freed up at Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS) and Department of State Health Services (DSHS); however, this adjustment will be reflected only when the funds have been transferred.

- B. This adjustment reflects the appropriation pursuant S.B.1, Article IX, Sec 17.78, *Contingency Appropriation for S.B. 7*.
- C. This adjustment reflects the appropriation pursuant S.B. 1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec 17.03, *Enterprise Resource Planning Projects*.
- D. This adjustment reflects the reduction in appropriations for Goal B Medicaid pursuant to S.B.1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec 17.24, *Medicaid Appropriation Reduction*. Medicaid general revenue appropriations have been reduced by \$40 million, with an associated reduction in federal matching funds of approximately \$56 million.
- E. This adjustment reflects changes in estimated federal funds per S.B. 1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec. 8.02, *Federal Funds/Block Grants*. Amounts have been updated in this month's report to reflect the February updates in the Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Plan (CHIP) caseloads as well as the changes as the result of the six-month phase down of the ARRA FMAP.
- F. This adjustment reflects the transfer of general revenue funds from appropriation year 2011 to appropriation year 2010 to address funding needs in Goal B Medicaid and Goal C CHIP strategies pursuant to HHSC Rider 7, *Appropriation Transfers between Fiscal Years*.
- G. HHSC Rider 33, *Appropriation of Unexpended Balances – Master Lease Purchase Program (MLPP)* appropriates any unexpended balances of MLPP funds from previous appropriation years for the Texas Integrated Eligibility Redesign System (TIERS) project. This adjustment updates the S.B. 1 appropriation (Automated Budget and Evaluation System of Texas 0781 (ABEST)) with the amount anticipated to be utilized in 2011.
- H. This adjustment reflects the carry forward of *unexpended* capital budget balances from appropriation year 2010 pursuant to S.B.1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec. 14.03(j). Schedule 7 of this report details the capital projects with unexpended balances included in this adjustment. No change from the prior report.
- I1-I3 In accordance with S.B. 1, 81st Legislature, Regular Session, Article II, Special Provisions, Sec 7, HHSC requested approval in May, 2010 to utilize the additional general revenue resulting from the final federal fiscal year 2011 regular Medicaid FMAP rate. These adjustments reflect the impact of the 2011 FMAP change on federal funds and related general revenue matching funds retained at HHSC. Approval was also received to transfer general revenue made available from the FMAP change to HHSC from the DADS. This adjustment will be reflected when

the funds are actually transferred.

- J. In a letter dated March 16, 2010, HHSC requested approval, pursuant to S.B.1, 81st Legislature, Article XII, Sec. 5(a) and 6, to expend ARRA federal funds for the Texas Health Information Exchange (HIE) project. This adjustment reflects the estimated expenditures for that project in appropriation year 2011.
- K. This adjustment reflects the increase in estimated federal expenditures related to implementation of the Health Information Technology (HIT) provisions of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. In a letter, dated, February 25, 2010, HHSC requested approval, pursuant to Article XII, Sec. 5(a) and 6, to expend ARRA Medicaid funds for the development of a State Medicaid HIT Plan (SMHP).
- L1-L3 These adjustments, pursuant to S.B.1, 81st Legislature, Article II, Special Provisions, Sec. 11, *Limitations on Transfer Authority*, transfer funding and/or capital budget authority between health and human services agencies to implement several Information Technology projects. Adjustment L1 is pursuant to HHSC's request, dated December 15, 2009, to transfer funds to other enterprise agencies for the purpose of paying their share of expenditures for several projects. Adjustment L2 implements the HHSC request dated June 23, 2010 and reflects transfers to HHSC from the DADS for the E-mail project.
- Adjustment L3 is pursuant to HHSC's request, originally dated October 19, 2009, and updated March 22, 2010, to transfer funding and capital authority to health and human services agencies for the telecommunications enhancement project.
- M. This adjustment, pursuant to S.B.1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec. 6.22, *Definition, Appropriation, Reporting, and Audit of Earned Federal Funds*, and HHSC's notification dated September 29, 2010, reflects the carry forward of Earned Federal Funds collected in fiscal year 2010 in excess of the amount appropriated in the Act. The additional funds will be utilized in fiscal year 2011 in Strategy A.2.1., Consolidated System Support.
- N. This adjustment reflects the transfer, pursuant to HHSC Rider 61, *Office of Eligibility Services*, and HHSC's letter dated April 8, 2010, of \$16.7 million from Goal B Medicaid to A.1.2., Integrated Eligibility, and F.1.1., TIERS, for the statewide rollout of TIERS and to provide the state match to maximize federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Department of Defense funds. The adjustment also includes the transfer of \$31.0 million in general revenue from Goal B Medicaid to A.1.2., Integrated Eligibility, approved under the notification provision of Rider 61(a) to maintain staffing and operations at the fiscal year 2009 levels.
- O. Pursuant to HHSC Rider 45, *Graduate Medical Education*, this adjustment reflects the receipt of funds from state-owned teaching hospitals to be used as the non-federal share

for graduate medical education in strategy B.2.1., Cost Reimbursed Service. Amount is updated this month.

P. This adjustment is pursuant to the authority provided in S.B. 1, 81st Legislature, Article IX, Sec. 8.03, *Reimbursements and Payments*. No change from the prior month's report.

Q. Pursuant to HHSC Rider 13, *Additional Medicaid Program Income*, this adjustment reflects the actual receipt of program income as of January 2011 in excess of the amount estimated in S.B. 1, 81st Legislature.

BUDGET VARIANCES

The variances in Schedules 3 and 5 of this report reflect the February, 2011, update of caseload and cost trends and FMAP assumptions in the Medicaid and CHIP program.

We have not included in this report a number of appropriation adjustments impacting budget variances in Schedules 3 and 5 that were included in the agency's Legislative Appropriations Request and/or the February update for Medicaid and CHIP. These adjustments will be included in future reports only as required notifications are submitted, approvals received, revenues collected, and/or actual adjusting entries are processed in the Uniform State Accounting System.

Note that Schedule 3 indicates balances in the variance column for certain estimated appropriations that HHSC projects will not be fully realized and for others that HHSC anticipates will exceed the initial S.B.1 appropriation.

- Appropriations that are anticipated to result in lapsed budget authority because revenues will not be collected are expressed as a positive variance (3643 Premium Co-payments, Low Income Children, 8075 Medicaid Cost Sharing, 8081 Supplemental Vendor Drug Rebates, 666 Appropriated Receipts, and 777 Interagency Contracts).
- Appropriations for which revenues are projected to exceed the SB 1 estimate are reflected as a negative variance (706 Vendor Drug Rebates - Medicaid, 8044 Medicaid Subrogation Receipts, and 8062 Appropriated Receipts – Match for Medicaid).

Finally, note that Schedule 3 reflects no variance for federal funds. In an effort to focus on anticipated general revenue shortfalls and/or surpluses, HHSC has increased the Operating Budget column prior to actual revenue collection for those federal funds that it projects will exceed the S.B.1 estimate and has decreased the Operating Budget for those for which federal revenues are anticipated to be less than the S.B.1 estimate.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS REPORT

This is the fifth report for budget year 2011. In this report, HHSC has included adjustments that have occurred through January 31, 2011. The significant change from the prior month's report is the update of caseloads, costs, and FMAP assumptions in the Medicaid and CHIP programs.

OTHER KEY BUDGET ISSUES

The Method of Finance used throughout the report is based upon currently known federal cost allocation factors and methodologies and will be updated as required by the federal government, which could result in future Method of Finance adjustments.

In an effort to assist in monitoring the status of requests for approvals on various issues, the table below lists pending appropriation year 2011 requests, the date submitted, and the status of approval or disapproval as of March 1, 2011. We acknowledge that the method of approval or disapproval varies depending on the conditions of the cited provision and may become approval by default. Correspondence regarding funding adjustments that require notification only is not included in the table.

On March 1, 2001, HHSC received approval to transfer general revenue funds from the DADS to the HHSC to implement the State of Texas Access Reform Plus long term care (Medicaid Managed Care), HHSC (STAR+PLUS) model in the Dallas and Tarrant service areas (letter dated December 22, 2010). The portion of the request related to authority to use Inter-Governmental Transfers as a method of finance in the STAR+PLUS strategy is still under review.

CAPITAL BUDGET ISSUES

The projected expenditures in Schedule 7 (Capital Projects) reflect the expenditures included in the HHSC 2012-2013 Legislative Appropriations Request. Adjustments to the Operating Budget include carry forward of unobligated capital balances from fiscal year 2010 and approvals that processed in the reporting period. Future adjustments will be reflected in Monthly Financial Reports as revenues are realized and/or actual adjusting entries are processed in the Uniform State Accounting System.

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The Capital Projects schedule has been updated to reflect current year-to-date expenditures. There were no adjustments to the Operating Budget for the reporting month. Integrated Eligibility Technologies (TIERS) projections (51004) have decreased by \$1,055,867 to reflect decreased federal funds associated with vendor negotiated savings.
